Hershey has always had a strong culture and sense of community. It's what makes our town so special. Whether you grew up in Derry Township or moved here a year ago, our community pride is what ties us all together.

Since our recreation center was built in 1963, our community and its recreation needs have grown. The new Hershey Community Center is the vision of our residents. It will serve us and generations to come. The new center, which will open in the spring of 2020, will give residents of all ages additional aquatics opportunities,

increased space to hold community meetings and classes, and places to enjoy socializing together. It will also provide a home for our local senior center and offer expanded programs for our students after school.





The State of the Current Facility

Unfortunately, the current facility no longer meets the needs of the community and many of the mechanical and structural components are beyond repair. Overall, the community's recreational, social, cultural and aquatic needs cannot be fully met due to the lack of current indoor programming and aquatic space.

In addition, the Recreation Center's close proximity to the school district campus has produced a clear need for a more robust after school collaborative program. For these and many other reasons, we must do something to more fully meet the recreational needs of the individuals who live and work in our community.



A New Home for Active Seniors

Another active recreation program in our community, The Senior Center, will call the Hershey Community Center home when its

current lease expires in 2020.

The Senior Center strives to create a welcoming environment for active adults to enjoy fitness classes, educational experiences, social opportunities, and community service projects. With more than 700 members, the Center provides a retreat for about 140 local active adults per day.





A Vision for a New Hershey Community Center

The new Hershey Community Center was designed to reflect input from Township residents. Working with consultants Ballard King & Associates and Kimmel Bogrette Architecture + Site since 2014, the Township completed a feasibility study and operations analysis for a new facility in 2017. The results of each study were presented at public meetings.



The key components of the new facility will be:

- Increased area from approximately 40,000 to 110,000 square feet
- Multi-purpose space for recreation programs and community use, including classrooms and flexible large group meeting space
- A 50-meter dividable indoor pool for competitive swimming. Increased aquatic programming and water availability for the community as well as Hershey High Swimming & Diving, and the Hershey Aquatic Club
- New outdoor and leisure pool
- Multi-purpose gymnasium
- Indoor walking and running track
- Fitness opportunities including exercise rooms and studios
- Dedicated space for The Senior Center
- Child watch services
- Dedicated space for after school programs
- Party Room on pool deck for celebrating special occasions

The Benefits to the Community

The construction of a new community center provides far more than just increased recreational opportunities. There will be considerable economic and other material benefits to the community including:

- Much-needed multifunction space that can be used by community groups for meetings and programs
- A considerable boost to the local economy through the ability to host swim meets, diving and synchronized swimming events, Special Olympics, basketball, volleyball, pickleball and other athletic events
- Local restaurants, hotels, shops and other related businesses will see significant boosts in patrons on event weekends
- Including The Senior Center as part of the project creates a true community center for people of all ages and abilities and creates the opportunity for intergenerational programming and learning

- The ability to finally address the gap in the availability of after school programming – especially for middle school students
- Further collaboration and sharing of space between the Department of Parks & Recreation and the Hershey Public Library will allow for expansion of services to residents
- A new community center will also boost workforce development and help to attract and retain top talent to the area

The total project cost of approximately \$32 million will be funded through a variety of sources. The Township has developed a funding approach that includes local and state resources in addition to a capital campaign of \$5,000,000.
